FAMILY REUNION WITH FOREIGN SPOUSE OR CHILDREN

AUGUST 2018

General information:

- If you are married or get married to a foreign citizen (non EU), or if you are a parent of a child living in Germany and wish to seek gainful permanent residency in Germany (or staying in Germany longer than 3 months) in order to live with your family, it is required to obtain a residence permit in the form of a visa.
- Processing of the visa takes up to 12 weeks upon submission of complete documents. The residence
 permit can be issued only upon approval by the competent authorities in Germany. You will receive a
 prompt notification upon completion of the processing. We ask that no status request is made if the
 required 10 weeks processing period has not yet passed.
- After the application has been approved, the German Embassy will issue a residence permit in a form
 of a visa with the duration for the first 90 days. A final residence permit for the whole duration of your
 course will be granted in Germany by the Aliens Authority. The Aliens Authority requires all residence
 permit holders to register upon their first arrival.
- It is recommended that at no time a flight ticket should be purchased until a visa has been granted.
- The fee for the processing of the visa application is the equivalent of **EURO 75.00 in NAD** (This non-refundable charge is payable in **cash or by credit card** when applying).

German language Skills:

• In order to facilitate integration, visa applicants generally must prove basic German skills when applying for a visa.

Competency in the German language in this case means that the applicant has the ability to communicate in German on at least a basic level, i. e. holds a certificate of successful completion of a German language course level A1 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Certificates issued by an institution which performs testing in accordance with the standards of an Association of Language Testers in Europe (ALTE) are accepted. These requirements are met by the Goethe-Institute. For information on language tests at the Goethe-Institute, please visit their webpage: www.goethe.de

Exceptions:

- If the applicant shows sufficient German language skills at the time of the visa application at the Embassy, no further proof would be required.
- If the applicant is married to a citizen of the EU (other than Germany), German language skills are not required according to the FreizügG/EU

Other exceptions may apply. This can only be determined after reviewing ALL documents during your appointment.

- Please prepare **two identical application sets** with **all** the following documents. Copies will not be made by the Embassy.
- This fact sheet is regularly updated but makes no claim to be complete.
- **Please note** that the German Embassy the right to ask for additional documents at any time during processing. Submission of the following documents does **not** guarantee that a visa will be granted.

Please submit the following documents in original plus 2 photocopies. Incomplete documentation may result in the rejection of your application.	
	duly <u>completed</u> visa application forms (please ensure that you sign the forms) passport (valid at least 3 months longer than the intended stay, at least 2 free pages, not older than 10 years)
	copies of your passports data page
	copies of your Namibian residence permit / proof of legal status in Namibia , e. g. work permit, study permit, etc. – if applicable
	2 recent passport photographs according to biometric specifications (see sample photos)
	copy of marriage certificate, when applying for a spouse reunion visa or copy of birth certificate long form of your child or registration of marriage appointment in Germany
	copy of proof of German language skills, at least level A1 (see requirements above)
	proof of housing in Germany with full address (e. g. renting contract, hotel reservation or invitation letter in case of private accommodation with name, full address and passport copy of inviting person)
	copy of the passport or ID from your spouse
	proof of spouse's earnings / financing of living in Germany (e. g. work contract, scholarship, bursary)
	TO BE PROVIDED AFTER THE APPROVAL OF THE VISA
	Flight reservation / itinerary with the applicant's name to Germany Proof of Travel / medical health insurance with the applicant's name (coverage for medical expensed: EUR 30,000, valid at least for Germany for the first 90 days). It is a requirement that claims against the insurance company are recoverable in a Member State. The <u>insured party</u> , <u>policy validity period</u> , <u>geographical coverage</u> and <u>schedule of benefits</u> must be mentioned in the policy schedule / certificate.

VISA APPLICATION: by appointment only
